The Hunt Library <u>website</u> (huntlibrary.erau.edu) is your gateway to specialized resources available in a variety of formats – from eBooks, streaming videos, and journal articles to books and conference proceedings.

Try searching many of our resources simultaneously via EAGLEseach. Or, access one of over 100 <u>research databases</u> (guides.erau.edu/az.php), focused on our core areas of study and loaded with full-text resources.

Need help discovering all of the resources available in the Library? <u>Research Guides</u> (guides.erau.edu) provide a starting point for research on a variety of subjects, while our <u>Library</u> <u>Basic Training</u> (huntlibrary.erau.edu/help/library-basic-training) tutorial teaches the basics of library research.
